An opportunity to improve your vision

Seeing clearly again is wonderful – now you have the chance to correct your eyesight at the same time.

What are cataracts?

Cataract refers to the clouding of your natural lens. Most cataracts are caused by natural changes in the lens brought on by age. You may notice that your sight just isn't quite right as cataracts generally develop slowly. Gradually your sight becomes cloudier, making it harder to see. Lights can seem to glare and you may notice that colours look different.

Your cataract treatment

Cataracts are treated by removing the cloudy lens and replacing it with an artificial plastic lens (an intraocular implant).

Our Consultants will discuss the treatment paths available to you and assist in making the right decision for you.

You'll undergo a comprehensive pre-operative examination which will cover your general health as well as a detailed assessment of your eyes.

Your Consultant will be able to identify which lenses will suit your individual needs.

It's a day case procedure so there's no overnight stay. Surgery is performed under drop-applied local anaesthetic which usually means spending three to four hours at the hospital.

You will be treated in our safe, comfortable and modern hospital.

Following treatment, you will have access to a 24/7 phone line so you can keep in contact with a qualified specialist Ophthalmic Consultant should you need to.

Benefit from a choice of advanced lenses

Seeing clearly again is wonderful – now you have the chance to correct your eyesight at the same time.

Standard lenses

The standard artificial lens implanted is monofocal.

Monofocal lens

The monofocal lens provides one focal point and you can therefore choose to have either clear distance vision or the near vision needed for reading, using a mobile phone, looking at a watch or choosing from a menu. Patients opting for this lens will need reading glasses or distance glasses after the surgery.

Special lenses

Multifocal lens

Multifocal lenses provide clear vision plus a full range of vision – distance, intermediate and near. The need for glasses afterwards is greatly reduced and most patients may not need glasses at all. There are some compromises with these lenses, which will be discussed at your consultation.

Toric lens for astigmatism

Toric lenses correct astigmatism and are available as a monofocal or multifocal lens.

Whilst many NHS and private facilities use general eye consultants or registrars to carry out cataract surgery, Benenden Hospital has made the conscious decision to provide Consultants who specialise in cataract surgery, because of their higher level of expertise in the field.

With the eye unit team performing thousands of cataract surgeries each year, our level of experience, expertise and clinical outcomes are among the best in the UK. Benenden Hospital now treats an equivalent number of patients to many local District General Hospitals, whilst maintaining outstanding clinical results.

If you wish to be assessed for special lenses you will need to attend a "special lens clinic" where you will be assessed by both an Optometrist and a Consultant, who will perform a number of tests to determine your suitability. There will be a detailed discussion about your lifestyle and what can be expected from each type of lens.

At the end of the consultation you will be able to book the date for your operation. The lenses required to give you the best possible vision will be ordered specially for you. The price charged for this service includes all assessments, operation and follow ups as well as the additional price of the special lenses.

Rapid treatment access

Self-paying or private medically insured patients can make an appointment straightaway, all you need is a report from your Optician.

Additional ophthalmic services

We offer a full ophthalmic diagnostic service where we are able to assess and diagnose any eye condition you may have.

We also offer a range of ophthalmic treatments which include YAG laser capsulotomy and a range of oculoplastic procedures. Including removal of lesions, Eyelid correction surgery, Brow lift and treatment for watery eyes. Please contact us for additional treatments.
